VARIETY TO THE RESCUE

The Variety Club, in the person of Scottish singer Kenneth McKellar, met the City of Glasgow, in the person of Lord Provost Jean Roberts, to present a mobile film unit. It will give free entertainment to children in orphanages, homes and residential schools in the city and surrounding districts. The mobile outfit was soon in use at a children's home. Variety Club, the charity run by show business people, has benefited nearly a million sick, needy and handicapped children in the past eleven years.
