BARNSLY V. LEICESTER.

Jimmy Walsh (left) was beaten in the toss by Barnsley Skipper Sharp, and the 40,000 crowd packing the Oakwell ground saw Leicester city kick off. Leicester playing left to right in this scene. This was the 6th Round Replay, and how those Barnsley fans were hoping their heroes would humble the first division aristocrats. Leicester had an early escape. But right-back Len Chalmers managed to clear. The visitors attacked, switching play to the other end. Riley scored for Leicester.

Barnsley came storming back. Oliver equalized.

Oliver tested Banks. This time the Leicester goal-keeper was equal to the occasion and had no difficulty in getting the ball away, at some loss to his dignity.

Cup-tie nerves and frayed tempers brought the Referee's intervention. Nothing serious. The game went from end to end, though without any further score at half time.
