This confirms my telephone conversation of yesterday about the Opening on 20 April by the Minister of Power, The Rt. Hon. Mr. Richard Wood, of our Angle Bay Ocean Terminal. A general description of this terminal, which is linked by pipeline to our refinery at Swansea, is enclosed herewith.
