## GENERAL ARRANGEMENTS AND INSTRUCTIONS

1. It is suggested that no child under the age of seven years be allowed to walk in the procession, and that not less than one Teacher be appointed to every 24 Scholars. The Scholars must be formed Six abreast by the Superintendent and Teachers on leaving their respective Schools, this order being afterwards maintained throughout the procession, but they must not occupy the whole of the carriage way. A clear space of at least a yard should be available between the spectators on the footpath and the outer flanks of the procession to allow for free passage of Ambulance Workers, Police Officers, etc. Uniformed Youth Organisations may walk three abreast.

No School to arrive in Albert Square before 8-15 a.m.

2. Each School must enter Albert Square by the Street set opposite its name in the "Order of Procession" and upon arrival will be directed to its position by one of the Marshals. Schools will face the Town Hall. the ranks being well closed up. The Scholars must not wander aimlessly about the square.

3. Bands must cease playing before entering Albert Square, and be then formed close to but not upon the footpath in front of the Town Hall, at the heads of the columns in which their Schools are placed.

THE POLICE HAVE INSTRUCTIONS TO KEEP THE FOOTPATH IN FRONT OF THE TOWN HALL CLEAR

4. The Route of the Procession from Albert Square will be by way of Princess Street, Mosley Street, Market Street and Victoria Street to the Cathedral.

5. Schools attending the Cathedral Service (Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4 & 5) will commence to leave Albert Square at 9 a.m. (before the Albert Square Service). On arrival at the Cathedral they will proceed round the Cathedral by Fennel Street and Cathedral Street, and enter by the South Door. (The remainder proceed to their respective parishes.)

6. Divine Service in the Cathedral will commence at approx. 10 a.m.. It is requested that Marshals and Teachers help protect the lawns surrounding the Cathedral and assist the Cathedral Staff in seating the Congregation. Bands should cease playing when passing the Cathedral whilst the Service is in progress.

7. The Service in Albert Square will begin at approx. 9-20 a.m. immediately after the Schools attending the Cathedral Service have left the Square.

All Schools are invited to be present in Albert Square for the Service.

Schools arriving before the Service are specially requested not to break rank until after the Service.

Service Sheets will be provided for the Cathedral and Albert Square Services.

Mr. W. Hardwick, F.R.C.O., L.R.A.M., A.R.C.M. (of St. Anne's, Manchester) will lead the singing from a raised platform opposite the front entrance to the Town Hall using a white flag as a baton. A sustained chord will be played by the band appointed and the singing must begin at the following beat of the baton.

8. The Procession of Schools from No. 6 onwards, will commence to leave the Square at approx. 9-45 a.m., immediately after the close of the Albert Square Service.
