

ARCHBISHOP ENTHRONED.

On a day sacred and historic in the Church of England Canterbury's splendid Cathedral witnessed the enthronement of Dr. Ramsey as Primate of all England. Present were 50 bishops and Archbishops some from abroad. Dignitaries of the diocese, ecclesiastics from all over the country escorted the magnificently robed Archbishop to the West Door of the Cathedral, before the procession along the nave.

Thus began the ceremony of enthronement whose origins go back to the year 1205.

The venerable Dean, 87 years of age, presented the Canterbury Gospels, the 5th century Italian manuscript, believed to have been given to St. Augustine by Gregory the Great.

By the Archdeacon of Canterbury at the Archiepiscopal Throne, Dr. Ramsey was inducted into the Archbishopric. This was in the Quire, out of sight of the congregation in the nave. Then, in view of them all, the Archbishop took his seat on the marble throne of St. Augustine, vested with all the authority of his great office.
