BRITISH PRIME MINISTER
TO ATTEND OPENING CEREMONY
OF THE SOVIET EXHIBITION

The Rt. Hon. Harold Macmillan, P.C., M.P., Prime Minister of the United Kingdom, the Rt. Hon. The Earl of Home, P.C., Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and several other members of the British Government have accepted invitations from the President of the Chamber of Commerce of the U.S.S.R. to attend the opening ceremony of the Soviet Exhibition, which will take place in Earls Court at 10.30 a.m. on Friday, July 7th.

The Chairman at the ceremony will be Mr. N.V. Nesterov, President of the Chamber of Commerce of the U.S.S.R., who will speak first. The second speaker will be the Rt. Hon. Reginald Maudling, P.C., M.P., President of the Board of Trade. The final speech will be made by Mr. N.S. Patolichev, Minister of Foreign Trade of the U.S.S.R., who will open the exhibition.

After Mr. Patolichev has declared the Exhibition open, he will take. Mr. Macmillan and the other members of the platform party on a tour of the exhibition, followed by over 1,000 other distinguished quests.

The ceremony and the tour of the exhibition will be televised live by Associated Television Ltd. throughout the ITV network. The programme will also be relayed through the Eurovision network to the Soviet Union.

Members of the public will not be admitted to the exhibition on July 7th until 12.30 p.m.

The Soviet Exhibition, like the British Trade Fair in Moscow, is being held under the joint sponsorship of the Chamber of Commerce of the U.S.S.R. and the Association of British Chambers of Commerce and is organised by the Soviet Chamber of Commerce in conjunction with Industrial & Trade Fairs Ltd.
