

IRELAND WINS CAR CLASSIC

The Solitude Grand Prix, at Stuttgart, a race which Stirling Moss hoped to add to his victories, had a field of 17 crack drivers.

They raced 25 laps of just over seven miles, total distance 177 miles. And a very twisty circuit it is. Innis Ireland, No.1, Lotus led for 23 laps.

Porsche cars gave a good account of themselves.

A nasty moment, but he got away with it.

After briefly losing the lead to Bonnier and Gurney, Innis Ireland regained it on the last lap.

What a finish. Ireland headed Bonnier at the end by only one tenth of a second. Dan Gurney, third. Ireland's average speed, 105 miles an hour.
