

MOTOR CYCLE GRAND PRIX.

Warming up for the 250 c.c. race in the Ulster Grand Prix. There was intense competition in this class; Alan Shepherd was riding an Italian MZ.

39 started. The race was twelve laps of the Dundrod Circuit, a total distance of 90 miles. British, German, Japanese and Italian machines were strongly represented.

Bob McIntyre, riding a Honda, was soon in the lead, followed by Mike Hailwood, also on a Honda.

Bob McIntyre was first home, at 95 and a half miles an hour. It was his first win in this Ulster classic. Mike Hailwood was second, Redman third, on a Norton. It was a wonderful race.

There was another big field in the 500 c.c. race. Right after the start came an accident. Boyce ran into Anderson, who had skidded on. That was two Nortons out of the race. Most of the others hurtled on, knowing nothing about the spill. Riding an M.V. Agusta was the Rhodesian ace, Gary Hoeking.

Expectation of 100-mile an hour laps was disappointed, the circuit now being a little wet.

Gary Hoeking won, though the rain made a record impossible. Under those conditions his average of 90.49 was a great show.
