

PIRIE WINS LAST RACE.

At the White City - England versus Russia. The Hundred Metres.

In 10-point-5 seconds David Jones was the winner. 2nd place secured by Prekhorovkiy (on the left). That miracle man in high jumping, N.V. Brunel, cleared seven-foot-three. He jumped seven-four-and-a-half in July. Now trying 7-foot-5, he couldn't quite make it.

What a tremendous jumper is this great Russian, Brunel.

Now the exciting Four-by-100 metres Relay; David Jones in action again.

On the last leg Alf Meakin's tremendous effort takes him past Politike, and on to win.

The big drama of the second evening was the 5,000 metres. Pirie and Snowden running for England. It was Gordon Pirie's last race as an amateur, and how that White City crowd longed to see him first home; and how he rose to the great occasion; in the final straight he held off the strong challenge of Snowden, with the two Russians nowhere. And there he was, first again, crowning a great career with a magnificent win.
