

NATIONAL INTER-CENTRE TEAM SCRAMBLE

CHAMPIONSHIP

For the "Daily Herald" Challenge Trophy

Thirteen teams representing motor-cycle Centres throughout the country line-up for the National Inter-Centre Team Scramble Championship of 1961.

Organised by Redditch Motor Cycle and Car Club and sponsored by the "Daily Herald", this end-of-season championship brings together the cream of Britain's rough-track aces.

Southern Centre are the present holders of the championship trophy and title. But there is a strong challenge from several teams in this year's event, any one of which could win through.

There are 20 Centres, each of which incorporates several counties, and the Inter-Centre Scramble is a competitive event between these Centres.

Each Centre has a team of four riders. There will be two 10-lap races with the four members of each team riding in both races. Points will be awarded to riders as they finish on a descending scale and the team with the highest aggregate number of points at the end of both races will be presented with the "Daily Herald" Challenge Trophy.

A tie on points will be decided in the following priority: (a) In favour of the team with the greatest number of finishers in both races. (b) In the case of more than one team having the same number, the team completing the greatest number of laps over the two races. (c) In favour of the team with the lowest aggregate time in both races.

Rollswood Farm offers splendid spectator vantage points and the rough-track itself is  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles long. Features include stream crossing, woodland tracks, rocks to avoid, steep gradient and fast open grassland where high speeds can be reached.

Beside the championship events there will be a full programme of supporting races.
