

100 STARS AT VARIETY CLUB'S CHARITY PERFORMANCE OF THE BILLY SMART CIRCUS

A hundred stars of screen, stage, television, records and sport are to attend the Variety Club of Great Britain's sponsored gala performance of the Billy Smart Circus at Wood Lane. Shepherd's Bush, London, on October 30th.

All proceeds are to be allocated to Variety Club's 'heart' fund for sick, needy and handicapped children throughout Britain.

JOHNNY HAYNES and TONY MACEDO, of Fulham F.C.; PHIL WOOSNAM, of West Ham, F.C.; JACK KELSEY, MEL CHARLES, JOHN McLEOD and GEORGE EASTHAM, of Arsenal F.C. The soccer line-up also includes BILLY WRIGHT, ex-England and Wolves captain, and WALLEY BARNES, ex-Wales and Arsenal captain.

Bruce Forsyth is to be Ringmaster for the evening and, as such, will be 'in charge' of arena activities.

The football personalities will play an exhibition-type game of soccer.

Many of the other celebrities will appear, in costume, in a Wild West presentation, "Gunfight at O.K. Corral".

Others will sing, play instruments, engage in comedy burlesques, join the clowns, and 'collaborate' in authentic circus acts.

There will be a special surprise item involving several national figures, none of them in show business, who have volunteered their services in the ring in the interests of charity.

All the personalities will join in a ring parade and a grand finale, during which they will throw streamers and balloons at patrons, who will themselves be given balloons on entering the Big Top.

As the stars arrive outside the circus, they will be spotlighted by three Army searchlights, mount a decorated rostrum, and be introduced.

Additional to the galaxy of personalities, the circus proper will feature many of the world's finest acts under Europe's largest Big Top.

In the audience as guests will be 1,000 children from homes and youth organisations supported by Variety Club, hospital nurses and Chelsea Pensioners. The tickets for these special guests have been donated by Variety members and friends of Mr. Billy Butlin, a past Chief Barker (President) of the Club.

Mr. Butlin is organising the performance in conjunction with Mr. Billy Smart, the Circus 'Guv'nor', who is also a prominent Variety Club personality.

The show will start at 8 p.m.

The gala show will be the third to be given by Mr. Smart. The previous two performances, last year and in 1959, between them realised a total of £6,500. Mr. Butlin is confident that the coming performance will play to a packed house and produce a sum in the region of £3,500.

Variety Club, which this month celebrated its 12th birthday, has raised £730,000 for over 650 children's organisations, and numerous individual cases, in England, Scotland and Wales, benefiting an estimated 1,000,000 youngsters.

The Club's 720 members are in or associated with all sides of the entertainments professions, and the reigning Chief Barker is Mr. Irving Allen.
