

REBEL PARTY OUTLAWED

Bulawayo, Southern Rhodesia, took prompt measures against the kind of trouble that is common in other parts of Africa. The National Democratic Party organised sabotage to protest against the Southern Rhodesian new constitution. Rioters attacked buildings owned by Africans who don't support their Party.

Carrying wicker shields against stone throwing the riot police marched towards the African area, where more trouble was expected. The Democratic Party have been winning coloured folk, to get them on their side. Extra troops have been mobilised, in the drive to restore order.

By air, they keep watch for any hostile gatherings. There were plenty of meetings, where party leaders protested that the new Constitution doesn't give the African a square deal, but so far there have been no more outbreaks. Perhaps Southern Rhodesia has nipped the revolt in the bud.
