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## VILICS OF MERCY

Kenya's year-long drought, the verst for over 70 years, had already brought many farmers in this Hast Africa territory to the verge of starvation. Then the rains came. Not the erop-evelling rains so long somitod, but terrential desegours bringing floods and disaster in their wake.

A vest area of over 2,000 square miles was engalfed. 500,000 Kenyans, mostly formers and their families, were in imminent danger of starvation.

The already desperate situation had assumed the propertiens of a major disaste Reads, railways, and bridges were destroyed - whele villages were event away or completely out off.

To most the emergency a full scale operation was immediately mounted by the Reyal Air Feres, to drop feed and medical supplies to the stricken Africane. Local: based transport planes were seen joined by others flown in from Britain and the Middle Bast. Meanwhile a similar situation had arisen in Semulia.

Working together, the Army, Hany, and Reyal Air Feros have already dropped well over 2,000 tens of supplies in Kenya and Semalia.

This passes operation was backed by widespread help in each from the people of Britain and other Commonwealth countries, and food supplies also came from the Governments of Britain, America, and the Control African Pederation.
