FUNERALS OF VICTIMS OF ANTI GAS DEMONSTRATIONS IN PARIS

Paris, February 13. 1968

36 un.developed positive: 42 meters

Following the stern of last February 8th demonstrations -demonstrations which had been forbidden, as any other street demonstrations by Government Authorities - and whilst a general strike paralysed most of Paris' activities, a crowd estimated at 200,000 came to the official funerals of the eight victims of the dramatic February 8th clashes with police forces.

Starting from the Worker's Associations Hall to reach the Père Lachaise Cemetery, the long long cortege followed the eight coffins which were preceded by hundreds of wreaths bearers, and thousands of flower bouquets.

France's sadness in front of these victims is a sad and definite sentencing of violence wherever they may come, and misunderstandings following such violence.
