Its has lain derelict since 1924 but is being renovated by volunteer workmen for conversion into a museum. In the Main Cell Block timber and woodworking machines may be seen and scaffolding is also visible in several shots.</p>		
<p>This story would have great Irish interest because of the historical jail and the almost legendary De Valera name in conjunction. Abroad, I think the "Evening Herald" line would carry it. Incidentally, amongst those he met was the last Governor of the Jail.</p>
