10.45PM STRIKE BALLOT MAY FOLLOW NURSES MARCH.
BRITAIN'S NURSES MAY BE CALLED UPON TO VOTE IN A STRIKE
BALLOT.

ANNOUNCING THAT A VOTE MAY BE PUT TO THE 60,000 NURSING
MEMBERS OF THE CONFEDERATION OF HEALTH SERVICE EMPLOYEES,
MR W.J. JEPSON, GENERAL SECRETARY, TOLD A MASS
DEMONSTRATION OF NURSES AND MIDWIVES IN GLASGOW TONIGHT THAT
THERE IS TO BE A MARCH IN LONDON ON SATURDAY WITH AN OPEN AIR
MEETING IN TRAFALGAR SQUARE, AND HE HAD ALREADY
BEEN ADVISED THAT NURSES FROM ALL PARTS OF ENGLAND AND WALES
WERE COMING.

HE SAID "EIGHT THOUSAND NURSES ARE COMING AT THEIR OWN EXPENSE
TO PROTEST.

"IF WE CANNOT RESOLVE THIS ISSUE BY THESE METHODS WE SHALL
TRY TO RESOLVE IT IN OTHER WAYS. AS A CONFEDERATION WE WILL
UNDERTAKE TO BALLOT OUR MEMBERS TO GET THEIR VIEWS ON THE QUESTION
OF THE WITHDRAWAL OF LABOUR AND IF THE WITHDRAWAL OF LABOUR VOTE
IS OVERWHELMINGLY IN FAVOUR WE SHALL SEEK TO IMPLEMENT IT, BUT
IT WON'T BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CONFEDERATION OR OF THE
NURSES: IT WILL BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE GOVERNMENT."

HE SAID HE INTENDED TO SUGGEST LATER THAT EVERY NURSE IN THE
COUNTRY SHOULD SEND A LETTER TO THE PRIME MINISTER ON THE SAME
DAY.
