

THE ROYAL CALEDONIAN BALL

The 114th Royal Caledonian Ball, the only Scottish ball of the London Season, is being held under the chairmanship of Lady Gillian Anderson.

This year more dancers than ever before (nearly 200) are taking part in the Set Reels and every Scottish regiment (with the exception of the Cameronians) have officers dancing. Mrs. Ralph Stewart-Wilson has organised the set reels which will be led on to the floor by the Duke of Atholl, (his partner is Lady Gillian Anderson), at the head of the Atholl Highlander reel.
