Well, they may be <u>called</u>, Nasty, but they look and handle like real ladies; and their designer, Jan Linge (that's hime) has every reason to be proud of them. They pack quite a punch too, four 21-inch torpedoes, one 40-milimetre Bofors gun, and one 20-millimetre Oerlikon.

They're built at Oslo, but their engines are British 5,100 horsepower Napier-Deltic Diesels, remotely controlled from the
bridge. One reason the Morwegian Navy chose these engines is because
they start quite happily even when it's freezing outside. Very important
if yeu're a Viking.
