In 45.9 seconds Brightwell wins splendidly; only one fifth of a second slower than the world record.

The dramatic finish of the three miles. The bare-footed Bruce Tulloh beating the 18-year-old Canadian marvel Bruce Kidd.

The winner's time, 13 mins., 16 seconds, only 6 seconds outside the world record.
