KELLY WINS ENVISEERRY HILL CLIMB

All roads lead to Ennisherry, as noter-racing fans
flock to County Wicklew for the race of the season - the third
annual speed hill climb, organised by the Irish Motor Bacing
Club. Thirty-nine cars are entered, ranging from a Standard Morris
to a supercharged Maserati.

As this is a time trial the drivers are sent away at half minute intervals, with an electric time strip, recording their ascent. The handicaps stretch up to 15 seconds.

Last away, racing from scratch, is the Mascrati driven by Joseph Helly, well-known Clendalkin driving acc.

Out on the course, a Standard Morris Eight leads the way - having started off with the highest time advantage. Three runs have to be completed over the hilly road - just over three-quarters of a mile leng.

Kelly's Maserati looks a winner all ever, as it makes light work of this siff test.

An ordinary piece of cotton marks the finishing line.

When it breaks, the timing apparatus records each arrival.

The winning time comes with Kelly's Maserati. His average

54 miles-an-hour is only a tenth of a second below the record and earns him the Meath Trephy.
