THE ROYAL VISIT

To Hastings Castle, built by William the Conquerer and now purchased by the Corporation, Princess Elizabeth is escorted by the Mayor at the start of her Sussex tour. And by gift of the owner the nearby glens too now belong to the town. In the grounds 12 fishermen, members of the lifeboat crew, are presented to her Reyal Highness.

As a memente Princess Elisabeth joins the well-known fishermen's charity organisation, the Winkle Glub, and is presented with a gold and pearl emblem.

At the Central Cricket Ground, ten thousand people, including five thousand children welcome Princess Elisabeth when she arrives to receive the title-deeds. The glons and eliffs were presented by Major Carlisle Sayer to mark this Festival year.

After handing the deeds to the Mayer, the Princess speaks.

In the county Town, the Mayer of Lowes, Alderman Parish does the honours at Southever Grange where the Princess planted a tree, and it's a big moment for some of the secuts.

At Worthing, nurseaform a guard of honour at Courtlands Escovery Hospital, which Princess Elizabeth declared open. Buring her four days' tour the Princess is covering a wide area of Sussex, so there's not a let of time to spare.
