Here's Derrycarne, an Irish entry for the International Jumping Competition, ridden by Lieutemant Colonel B.J. Corry.

Now a Swiss horse, Vernumft, trained in Frence and ridden by Captain

Now Forhunter with Colonel Llewellyn in the saddle; the same combination that won a magnificent victory for Great Britain in the Olympic Games.

This is Ballymenty, another Irish horse, ridden by Captain Tubridy. Forhunter, the favourite, is just three-fifths of a second behind the French horse, Ali Baba, which takes first prise.
