DUBLIN HORSE SHOW.

Once again the Royal Dublin Society's Horse Show draws the crowds to Ball's Bridge - and no wonder. There are more than a thousand entries from five countries, and all of them good 'uns! Great Britain, Sweden, Switzerland, France - and of course Ireland - are all competing. In recent days, thousands of visitors have streamed into Dublin's fair city from all over the world to see this magnificent spectacle of grace and skill.

Here's Darrycarne, an Irish entry for the International Jumping Competition, ridden by Lieutenant Colonel D.J. Curry.

Now a Swiss horse, Vermaat, trained in France and ridden by Captain Lombard.

Now Foxhunter with Colonel Llewellyn in the saddle; the same combination that won a magnificent victory for Great Britain in the Olympic Games.

This is Ballyaenty, another Irish horse, ridden by Captain Tubridy. Foxhunter, the favourite, is just three-fifths of a second behind the French horse, Ali Baba, which takes first prize.
