UNARMED VICTIM OF NAZI BOMBER

One of the small ships of the Trinity House Service..... was carrying out her normal routine work off the East Coast. she was taking out men to a light ship to relieve those who had been on duty for a month. She was completely unarmed. Suddenly out of the sky a Nazi bomber swooped down... raking her decks with machine gun bullets. Men of the crew went down like ninepins. When the Nazis found there was no reply to their attack they swooped even lower, dropping bombs. The Trinity House ship was not sunk...but here is the mark of Nazi warfare.

A German newspaper recently published an interview with a Nazi pilot. That bright boy said that every time he sank an unarmed merchantship he trembled with joy. That's the Nazi point of view. You can compare it with an historic remark of one of the French Kings of the 18th Century, when he was at war with England.

One of his ships had carried off the men of the Eddystone Lighthouse as prisoners. King Louis the fourteenth ordered their release saying " These men work for the benefit of all Nations. I am at war with England not with humanity". but the Nazis think differently.
