The most thrilling parade of the War! Men of AJAX and KESTER, London greets you!

The Gazette's sound recording car (by special permission) leads the march of triumph through dense crowds of hero-worshippers O - and how they worship!

The day holds an even bigger thrill, than was expected, for the heroes of the great battle with the GRAF SPEE, are to be inspected by His Majesty the King.

The Royal inspection is to take place on Horse Guards Parade, and here, the 760 Officers and men form a hollow square facing the Admiralty Building.

Accompanied by Mr. Churchill, First Lord of the Admiralty, His Majesty advances to greet the members of his Cabinet, led of course by Mr. Chamberlain complete with umbrella. While her Majesty the Queen watches from an Admiralty Balcony, ...The inspection;

Meantime, thoughts are centred upon the great engagement in which AJAX KESTER and ACHILLES brought about the inglorious end, of the Nazi Raider, GRAF SPEE. It is for the heroic deeds performed by Officers and men of AJAX and KESTER (not forgetting ACHILLES - NOW IN NEW ZEALAND) that the King is decorating some of their numbers today.

The cheers seem to grow in intensity as the first "Rating" is decorated. And the cheers are tempered with sadness, as Mrs. Russell, (widow of

Marine Russell of the EXETER) receives the medal, her husband won. He carried on throughout the action, despite terrible wounds, from which later he died.

And now the gallant representatives of all that is best on the seven seas today, march past Their Majesties, en route for London's Guildhall.

Nelson looks down onna scene, the like of which is seldom witnessed, even in the heart of the Empire as the King and Queen talk to relatives of those, who gave their lives in The Great Cause, - - sad moments!

And so to the Guildhall, where we were privileged to film one or two highlights of the speeches, after the Luncheon (given by the Lord Mayor) to the GRAP SPEE Conquerors.
