INTERNATIONAL FOOTBALL IN DUBLIN

The big question at Dallymount Park is whether the Scots coming out now can avenge their defeat of last season by an Irish eleven, and 21,000 people turn up to see them try. The visiting team have been travelling all night and have been obliged to take a special train to Dublin from Belfast. The Irish eleven open with a strong attack and after about four minutes play a grand combined movement by the forwards gives Dunne the chance to put them one up. Then the Scotsmen rally and for the next quarter of an hour the crowd are treated to some of the slickest play ever seen at Dallymount, and more than once the home goal escapes by a miracle. Then Scotland attack again, and now they equalise. Twelve minutes later Scotland notch another one which is soon equalised again for Ireland, and it looks like the game will finish in a draw. But now the fine teamwork of the Scots begins to show and they worn their way through to score the winning goal, making Ireland 2, Scotland 3. So the Scots turn the table in a grand game.
