BOMBED AND TORPEDOES... BUT SAFE.

Vivid pictures of a naval action in the North Sea have just been released. Members of the crew of H.M.S. KELLY take to the boats after the Flotilla leader had been struck amidships, by a torpedo fired from a German Motor Torpedo-boat.
