Then with a forward rush to the Cambridge 25 things begin to happen, the light blues putting on an even greater burst of speed and with just 10 minutes to go are leading by a goal and a try, to nil. A converted try and a drop goal give Oxford nine points and a last try by Cambridge makes the score

Cambridge eleven points and Oxford nine. A good game and an exciting finish.
