THE PRIME MINISTER WITH THE TANKS.

Mr. Churchill goes among the tanks. The visit is to witness operational exercises of all types of mechanised equipment. The men of the Tank Corps announce his arrival, and in an unmistakable manner tell you how welcome he is.

It was in the last war when the tank was first conceived, that Mr. Churchill, with others, saw its vast potentialities as an offensive weapon. It was he who sponsored the idea, and thus by keen judgment brought into being the first mechanised fighting unit. Today, the tank is the most potent weapon of land attack. The very methods of warfare have changed as a result of the rapid development of mechanisation.

General de Gaulle, who knows better than most men the essential importance of these land battleships, is also present with General Sikorski. With Mr. Churchill they see methods by which General Wavell cleared the Italians out of Cyrenaica.
