## NEW U.S. AMBASSADOR

The newly appointed American Ambassador to Britain, Mr. John G. Winant, arrives in England by air from Lisbon, and is met by the Duke of Kent. Here are his first words on arrival.

Leaving the aerodrome in company with the Duke, Mr. Winant takes train and is met by the King. It is the first time that a British Monarch has accorded such an honour to a new Ambassador. This Royal reception may be considered a reciprocal expression of good will and recognition, following Mr. Roosevelt's personal welcome to Lord Halifax. Mr. Winant arrives in this country on the eve of what may prove the most critical period in its history. To this good friend of Britain (who rather resembles Abraham Lincoln) we extend a warm welcome. Britain greets another representative of a great Country.
