...that he and his axis partners ^(cut).....would not relentlessly on this hemisphere of ours. Our national policy today therefore is this, first we shall actively resist wherever necessary and with all our resources every attempt by Hitler to extend his Nazi domination to the western hemisphere. ^(cut) We shall actively resist his every attempt to gain control of the seas. We will not hesitate to use our armed forces to repel attacks. Therefore with the profound consciousness of my responsibilities to my countrymen and to my country's cause I have tonight issued a proclamation that an unlimited national emergency exists and requires the strengthening of our defence. to the extreme limit of our national power and authority."
