BIG CIVIL DEFENCE PARADE.

Six thousand men and women, representing every branch of London's Civil Defence Service, assemble in Hyde Park and hear stirring words of praise and caution from Mr. Churchill.

Now to the martial music of massed Guards bands, the largest force of defence workers ever congregated marches past the Prime Minister.

Mr. Churchill takes the salute, and also salutes these veterans who have played such a magnificent part in the blitzkrieg over Britain.

The display also includes a fine spectacle by appliances of the London Fire Service.

Afterwards at the County Hall, the Prime Minister makes another fighting speech foreshadowing ever increasing devastation for the Hun.
