

AMERICA DELIVERS THE GOODS

Here is just a little of the motor transport alone which is now regularly arriving in large quantities at ports in the Middle East. The full value of our victories in East Africa becomes clear, when we realise that by winning complete control of the Eritrean coast line, we have removed practically every obstacle to the delivery of American war material, which is proceeding in a vast flood by the Red Sea Route.

The already partly assembled vehicles are speedily completed on the quayside. Time may again swing the weight of war back into the Western Desert, and we are making sure that no threat to our control of the Suez Canal shall be allowed to materialise.

Huge quantities of extra tyres arrive as a safeguard against transport becoming idle through lack of spares. As they don't run to filling stations in the desert, thousands of extra petrol tins will prevent dry tanks. Yes, this is only part of the American Service helping us to win the war.
