MORE TROOPS IN CYPRUS.

Approximately 350 miles away from German occupied Crete, Imperial troops arrive at Cyprus, the British Island in the Eastern Mediterranean. Lying off the Syrian Coast, the island is of immense strategic importance and the work of strengthening its defences goes on every day. Our cameraman in the Middle East sends us these pictures of activity, as men, motor transport and equipment arrive at one of the ports on the Island.

Much of the Island is rocky, but in the Central Plains such as here, engineers assisted by local labour are setting new guns into their emplacements. Much of the work is done without modern equipment. But the job is expertly done nevertheless.

Any Germany attack on Cyprus will indeed prove a hazardous adventure.
