U. BOATS ATTACK DUTCH ISLAND.

A new place name suddenly appears in the war news. Nazi submarines strike their first blows in the Caribbean, shelling the oil refinery, plant on the Island of Aruba. In the harbour of the little volcanic island lying off Venezuela, oil tankers are hit by torpedoes fired at point blank range. The U. Boats prowling in the waters of the Dutch West Indies evidently broke through the defence ring around Panama. Tragedy followed in the wake of the attack. A torpedo which missed its mark came ashore and later exploded while sightseers examined it. Four were killed. The fact that Aruba island contains the largest oil-refining installation in the world made it an important target.
