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U.S. Troops Parade in London.

For the first time for twenty two years, United States troops march through the streets of London on their way to routine kit inspection in a West End Park. Their modified battledress comprises dark khaki tunic, lighter coloured trousers and webbing equipment, forage caps and rubber soled boets. Lieutenant-Colonel Barnes commanding the units now in London walks up and down the ranks casting a critical eye on the general appearance of his men.

None of the troops wears anything that might reveal his units identity; but what's a shoulder flash between friends. It's the fighting man that counts.
