

PASSING OF BARNEY MELLOWS.

Among the many mourners at the funeral of Barney Mellows from the Hospice for the Dying at Harold's Cross, is Mr. de Valera who no doubt recalls memories of the 1916 rising in which Mr. Mellows took a prominent part. The procession at Glasnevin is composed of members of the veteran's association, the I.R.A. and many old comrades who form a Guard of Honour. Mr. Mellows was a brother of the late Liam Mellows, one of the Easter Week leaders in Galway, he was 46 and with other members of his family had been actively associated with movements for Irish Independence from an early age. The coffin is borne into the cemetery chapel for the last rites with the Rev. T. Walsh officiating. A salute from the firing party is followed by the last post.
