During a recent visit to an R.A.F. Bember Station, the King and Queen inspect members of its personnel within the shadow of a giant Halifax, one of the biggest types of bembing planes in service in the world.

Members of a WAAF unit stationed at this aerodrome also have an epportunity of seeing the King and Queen at close quarters.

The chief display is given by Parachute Troops. If first hand description of their descent is given Their Majesties by Major Frost, who led the parachute raid on the Nazis Radiolocation Station at Bruneval, and by Wing-Commander Pickard, who commanded the carrying force of bombers in the same daring attack.
