U.S. CHIEF OF STAFF REVIEWS AMERICAN TROOPS IN N. IRELAND

Allied leaders assembled in Northern Ireland are General Marshall, Chief of Staff U.S. Army, General Franklyn, Commanding British Forces in Northern Ireland; Mr. Andrews the Prime Minister, Mr. Averill Harriman, President Roosevelt's personal representative; General Hartle, Commanding the U.S. Army in Northern Ireland, and General Chaney, Commanding the U.S. Army force in the British Isles.
