DUNDALK'S FIRST CUP

Before a crowd of over 34,000, Cork United come out to meet Dundalk, at Dallymount Park for the Football Association of Ireland's Cup. The ground is hard and there's a testing breeze and it brings a thrill of excitement. In the whole of Dundalk's history it has been cup-less and there's a feeling that today something's going to happen, and it does. In the first half Dundalk play with the wind behind them. Lunn is an unexpected absentee from the side. Rice is at left half and MacArvil at right. The first half is without a score and Cork United's prospects look rosy in the second half, when in the seventh minute they take the lead. That goal is just the sort of medicine that Dundalk need. Five minutes after Cork's first goal Dundalk get on equal terms. O'Neill starts the movement by running down to take a throw-in by Donnelly. Barlow rushes in and heads the ball back to Kelly who shoots from point blank range. After 25 minutes, Dundalk takes the lead. Kelly from Levy's pass lifts the centre half and fires in a hard shot from the edge of the penalty area, the ball passes over Fowley's right arm into the net. For a time Cork besiege Dundalk's goal and force three corners, but Dundalk hold on to their lead. Nine minutes before the end, Levy scores a grand third. Dundalk win the Cup for the first time with a score of 3-1.
