Wearing his Air Force Uniform of Air Commodore of the R.A.F.,
Mr. Churchill makes an inspection at a Bomber Station during his
round of visits in the North East. Among other places is a
Tanks Corps Training Ground where the Prime Minister makes his
inspection while seated on the gun turret of a Covenantor.

An inspiring sight comes with a massed formation of Tanks and Planes driving and flying past the saluting base.

The Prime Minister's party which included Dr. Evatt, the
Australian Minister of External Affairs, later made a tour of a
munitions factory, where Mr. Churchill tries his hand at one of the
machines. The operator is able to show his how she makes things
hum at her section of the production line.

In the distance, you'll see Mr. Churchill exchanging a kiss for a cigar given to him by one of the women factory workers. From here we travel to where 25,000 people had griberrantside gathered outside Leeds Town Hall to hear words of encouragement on the work Britishers are doing in the War effort. The Prime Minister laid emphasis on our arrangements for meeting the enemy, thanks to the assistance of hundreds of thousands of active and willing hands.
