INTRODUCING THE MUSTANG.

The Mistang of the North American Prairies are wild horses, noted for their speed, fire and endurance. As speed, fire and endurance are the outskanding points of this Army Co-operational Aircraft, Mustang is just the right name for them. They also come from America ... California to be precise.

Those interested in technical details, will be interested to learn that the Mustang has a liquid-cooled Allison in-line engine of one thousand one hundred and fifty herse power, with single-stage supercharger. It has a wide track undercarriage fully retractable inwards. Tail wheel is also retractable. Speed...? Well, it's fast, very fast — the fastest Army co-operational aircraft in service anywhere; and that information must satisfy you for the time being. There is some similarity between the appearance of the Mustang and the M.E. 109E, the German fighter plane, due to the straight lines of the Mustang's wings, tail planes and rudder.

It's to be hoped that Jerry mistakes many Mustangs for M.E's.

So far, the Mustang's activities have been mainly low flying attacks against ground targets across the Channel, but they'll come in veryuseful when full scale Military operations open in the West.
