- 4, V.S. The battle of the convoy with guns going into action on the ship as the enemy planes come out of the skies. The battle goes on and through the dusk and when night comes the guns flashes can be seen. 250
- 5, V.S. Morning light and weary gun crews snatch rest where ever they can on the ships. 31
- 6, V.S. Rear Admiral Burroughs comes aboard H.M.S. Nelson for talks with Vice Admiral Syfret. 18
