## WEST OF VERONEZH

One of several armoured trains employed by the Soviet Forces moves up West of Voronezh in that region of embattled armies - The Don. A Red Army Officer spies out the land and establishes the place where his infantry will attack. Checking the time, he signals his men, and the operation to dislodge the enemy from their positions is underway. This is part of a big scale counter-attack in the sector mid-way between Moscow and Stalingrad. At the appointed time Russian artillery open fire and the whole front blazes up.

Russian bombers give close support, attacking the German forward positions and supply lines.

This may well relieve the pressure on ~~Stk~~ Stalingrad, and despite the fact that Voronezh is itself hard pressed, it is putting forward such effort to ease the strain at a critical moment. A clash like this may bring about surprising results.

The more dead Germans there are, the better. This is a fair example of the work being done by the men of Voronezh.
