Further pictures showing the occupation of Majunga by British
Empire troops have just been received. On the Waterfront of the
important Madagasean base, supplies and equipment are unloaded in the
daylight hours immediately following the midnight assault.

Sections of the Kings African Rifles played a prominent part in the
operations undertaken by United Kingdom, South and East African troops.

A matter of a few hours prior to this orderly entry by our supporting
forces, a lively action was taking place on the beaches and among
the manhouses, where the high tide nearly carried the invasion craft
on to the main seafront road.

The streets of Majunga presented an unruffled appearance; the Malagney taking the whole affair with equanimity. Outside the Town Hall they calmly read the preclamation amounting the surrender. Three hours had sufficed to give the United Nations control of this important port, with agreeably little force of arms.
