FIELD MARSHAL SMUTS ADDRESSES PARLIAMENT-LONDON 21-10-42

- 1, G.V. Inside the empty chamber prior to Smuts making speech, then dissolve through to crowded chamber. 20
- 2, M.S. Lloyd George, Mr Churchill and Smuts taking the stand in front of members of both houses. 15
- 3, L.S. Lloyd George says S.O.F. "I call upon Field Marshal Smuts to address you". 17
- 4, V.S. Field Marshal Smuts takes microphone. He starts off by telling of the honour of being asked to address the houses. He speaks of England's bravery and spirit. He refers to the China war, the war in Russia. He says "We have reached the fourth year of the war. The defence phase has now ended. The stage is set for the last, the offensive phase". He speaks of Hitler and the dark pages of modern history. He calls for a fight to the death for man's liberty. He tells of what we must do to win the peace when it arrives. He says "One thing has already emerged, that we have accepted the name of the United Nations, this is the new conception, much in advance of the old conflict of the League of Nations". He finishes with "and may heaven's blessing rest on our work in war and in peace". 830
- 5, Cut aways to members listening including shots of Attlee, Eden etc. 10
- 6, V.S. Mr Churchill takes microphone. He tells of the labours to get this great statesman Field Marshal Smuts to come to this country. He then calls for appreciation for his Smuts. 65
- 7, V.S. The house rises and applauds and tries to sing 'For he's a jolly good fellow'. 70
