## ROMMEL ON THE RUN.

Please to remember the 5th of November when the 8th Army was making bonfires with the Aris guys in the desert. With shattering effect the wonderful news of Rommel's fall scale retreat was let loose to the world. It was then that the first dramatic announcement telling of our victorious advance was broadcast. By direct transmission from Gairo, Godfrey Talbet, the B.B.C. War Correspondent in the Middle East radiced his electrifying despatch. We reproduce here his im historic words -

"Gut in the desert, out of Caire there has come tonight the news for which we have been waiting... the news that all the world that fights for freedom has been wwiting to hear. The news that the Besert and Caire have been expecting to be let loose all day. The Axis forces in the desert are in full retreat. There is no shadow of doubt about it... the enemy are on the run... and we are after them. Right on their heels - no half measures. Maybe some of the enemy did get out, but there would beethers in flight before the Eighth Army, or dead. It is heartening news indeed tonight, heartening news for the United Nations and the 8th Army."

The order of the day is "Wipe out the Axis in Africa". Every communique tells how the German and Italian columns are being releasing pursued and destroyed. Buy and might, there is no let up in the haumaring. The Mentgemery mincing machine is chewing the Afrika Korps to shreds. Outstanding in the battle is the R.A.F., maintaining a non-stop enalaught on the broken energy streaming back. The greatest British success of the war overseas has been struck at Rommel, Germany's ablest Commander. Outgeneraled and outfought.

The great tell of enemy prisoners is **manufactory minitive** mounting daily. 9,000 were taken in the first few days. Then 4,000 were quickly added. In their haste to save theirnown skins, the Germans left three divisions of Italians to their fate. And here now are the men whose namesring around the world -General Alexander our C-in-C Middle East. General Montgomery, Commander of the 8th Army who has won a

glorious victory thanks to the imperiabable British soldier.
