## PARATROOPS OVER TUNISIA.

Big Douglas Transport Planes lined upon Maison Blanche Aerodrome Algiers awaiting the take-off signal to carry British Parachute troops deep into Tunisia. All the men are veterans of 40 or 50 jumps and were formed into a Unit after Dunkirk. Most of them are Londoners.

Their mission is to clear the way for General Anderson's advancing First Army. Their destination is an important key town in Tunisia where they expect to join up with local French forces.
