The Upper Conduckiegg River above Banger, Haine, hundreds are employed in a revived industry, harvesting the ice crop. A swift outting power saw slices it into cakes twenty-two inches square. It partially re-freezes after it's sawed and the ice cowboys ride hard on large sections to start them riding on the way to the ice correl. With the river frozen to a depth of eighteen inches early in the season workmen send twenty-seven thousand tons up the conveyor type stored. With increase in refrigerated relivey cars demands for natural ice have risen sharply in the last few years. This equipment handles ten thousand cakes a day to chill your winter spinsch.
