UNIVERSITY BOAT RACE... OXFORD WIN.

Here's a scene to take your mind back a few years. Oxford & Cambridge meet in their second wartime boat race. The dark blues set out for Sanford Lock, the starting point of this race which, incidentally, will not count in official records. The course is a mile and a quarter stretch at Radley near Oxford. The Cambridge Crew by losing the toss will have a less favourable position, while the dark blues will be pulling on the Oxford side of the river. The two boats pull away for Sanford Lock. The boats drift up to the starting point with Cambridge nearest the camera. They're away to a good start, with Oxford establishing a lead from the moment the flag drops.

Two minutes rowing and Oxford have increased their advantage to a length.
